

• 94% of participating youth state they have had the opportunity to give back to their Club and community 6,463 sessions of fitness, behavior support, nutrition & positive relationships

• 94% of participating youth report they know that staying healthy means being clean and good personal hygiene

• 93% of participating youth feel that Club staff has provided them with multiple ways for them to be engaged in fitness, basic nutrition and healthy eating

• 90% of participating youth believe they have learned valuable decision making skills that will help them now and in the future
