Since 2014, our Teen Centers have offered the C.R.E.W. (Career Readiness Empowered Workforce) program, which exposes youth to job readiness and career exploration opportunities. Teens build resumes, develop strong work habits, and acquire essential decision-making skills while being mentored by local business professionals.

This past summer, 37 teens from Chico and Oroville participated in various job experience programs. They served as camp counselors, gained retail experience, provided customer service, conducted trail maintenance, and studied to earn Federal Communications Commission certifications.

Through hands-on experiences, youth learned to problem-solve, communicate effectively, and work as a team while building lasting relationships. For many, this was their first job experience. By summer's end, they had participated in a fun and enriching program, gained practical skills, achieved personal growth, and developed a stronger sense of community.

INSPIRING YOUTH OF THE YEAR



Starting with her local recognition as the Boys & Girls Clubs of Chico Youth of the Year in October 2023, she progressed through the North Valley, NorCal, and California State levels. In May, she brought home the title of Pacific Regional Youth of the Year. In September, she traveled to Atlanta to showcase her talents at the National Youth of the Year competition.

Although Arya didn't win the national title, this experience was life-changing. She won \$32,500 in college scholarships and will continue to shine as our local, state, and regional champion, serving as a BGCA ambassador through July 2025. Next, she will join the National Youth of the Year Speakers Bureau to elevate youth voices and advocate on key issues.

Arya's journey demonstrates the impact of empowering youth with opportunities and resources. Through our Youth of the Year program and the rigorous process of speeches and interviews, young leaders like Arya gain invaluable skills and the confidence to overcome challenges, emerging as community advocates. Thanks to your year-round generosity, our case management team provided essential assistance to families, stepping in to meet needs when other resources weren't available:

- 950 food bags for school breaks, ensuring families have pantry staples during critical times
- 241 families received back-to-school assistance
- 142 children were "adopted" through holiday and back-to-school programs
- \$66,475 in direct assistance
- 22 families secured and maintained stable housing

Looking ahead, we have 35 open case management cases, we're committed to the long-term recovery of Park Fire victims and with your support plan to support 600 families with holiday food bags and gifts, creating meaningful holiday moments for all.
